United Nations Peacekeeping



More than 61,000 UN peacekeepers are currently deployed around the globe in some of the most fraught regions. They stand between civilians and the forces of violence, between crisis and peace. Their bravery and commitment exemplify the UN's mission "to save succeeding generations from the scourge of war".

The UN's 11 current peacekeeping operations cost around \$6 billion a year, about a half percent of global military spending. UN Peacekeeping has a proven history of preventing conflict and atrocity crimes. Studies show that the presence of peacekeepers significantly reduces the risk of renewed warfare and the number of civilian deaths.

International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers

On this day, we remember the 4,433 UN peacekeepers from 120 nations who have lost their lives serving in the cause of peace. Of these, 106 were British. This International Day was first observed in 2003 on 29 May, the date in 1948 when the first peacekeeping mission began operations in Palestine.

About those we remember

Count Folke Bernadotte

In 1948, the United Nations appointed Count Bernadotte as its Mediator in Palestine but shortly after he tabled his peace plan that same year, he was assassinated in Jerusalem. He was the first member of United Nations staff to be killed in the line of duty. The wreath in his memory will be laid by his grandson Count Edward Bernadotte and his son Leonardo.

Commandant René de Labarrière

The French officer, Commandant de Labarrière, serving as a Military Observer in Palestine in 1948, was killed by a landmine, becoming the first United Nations peacekeeper to lose his life.

The UK in UN Peacekeeping

Royal Marine Drummers date back to 1664, upon the formation of the Royal Marine Corps.
