Brazil, Germany, India and Japan have issued joint statements seeking international support for their claims to become permanent members of the Security Council. Advocates for more representative membership of the Security Council and Board membership of the World Bank and the IMF argue that the current composition of the Security Council, last altered in 1963, skews its decision-making and weakens the UN's claim to universality. In recognition of these charges and in the face of today's extraordinary challenges, Kofi Annan appointed a High Level Panel to advise on how the UN should respon d. It is expected that the Panel's report will cover membership of the Security Council. This meeting offers a unique opportunity to hear these countries present their case and to engage in debate.
