Our activities

[Annual Ruth Steinkraus-Cohen Law Lecture](#)

Held in memory of Ruth Steinkraus-Cohen, the 19th lecture titled *Brexit, the Good Friday Agreement & the Constitutional Future of N. Ireland* was given by Professor Colin Harvey, Director, Human Rights Centre, Queen's University Belfast. The focus of his lecture was how the Good Friday Agreement deals with the questions of self-determination and sovereignty, issues that rest at the heart of the ethno-national conflict in and about Northern Ireland. In recognising that the precise mechanism used is of wider international significance and interest, he averred that the following month's 25th anniversary of the Agreement offers the opportunity for reflection and renewal and held out the possibility that it could one day lead to a viable framework for a United Ireland. Due to transport and teaching staff strikes, the event was held online.

[International Day of UN Peacekeepers](#)

Our 19th Conference to mark this UN anniversary was held online. It featured a dialogue between Jean-Pierre Lacroix, UN USG for Peace Operations and Dr Karin von Hippel, Director-General, RUSI. Panel discussions were titled *How effectively does the UN address the challenges of Peacekeeping?* and *The Digital*

Transformation of Peacekeeping, the latter held in the memory of Dame Margaret Anstee.

We were delighted to return to the traditional format for the wreath-laying ceremony at the Cenotaph. The Rt. Hon. Lord Ahmad, Minister of State for the UN, and Admiral Sir Tony Radakin, CDS, were joined by diplomats from ninety nations, contingents from four army units recently returned from UN deployment and many others. The Band of the Grenadier Guards provided musical support. We welcomed back pupils from the Grey Coat School for Girls and the City of Westminster School for Boys who directed the diplomats to their positions. United Nations Green, 2nd Birthday Party

We returned to United Nations Green for its 2nd birthday party, coinciding with the anniversary of Nelson Mandela's birth, welcoming those who, during the day, had walked the Mandela Mile, from his bust at the South Bank to his statue in nearby Parliament Square. Once again, members of the diplomatic community joined us, each planting their nation's flag in our giant *UN75 flags of the UN* display. Again, we enjoyed the peace dove release and access to the display of UN memorabilia in the Methodist Hall's archive room.

We continue to host the most authoritative information source on developments in the UN's continuing inquiry into the possible causes of the plane crash in which former UN Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjöld and fifteen others died in 1961.

Commonwealth members' stance on Ukraine

Following our search for reasons why certain Commonwealth nations refused to join the majority of UN member states in criticising Russia's invasion of Ukraine, we have set out our arguments in our blog and will continue to monitor their stances.

Annual General Meeting

Our AGM, held in January to mark the opening of the UN General Assembly in 1946, was held in parliament to a packed audience. The committee was elected and the annual financial report accepted.

Our speakers were Sara Shaw, International Program Coordinator for Climate Justice & Energy at Friends of the Earth International who reported on the principal outcomes of the recent COP27 meeting in Sharm el-Sheikh in Egypt, and the economist Benny Dembitzer, a Westminster UNA member, who pointed to the evident failures in the structure of the international aid programme which continued to hinder regeneration of indigenous farming patterns, worsening dependence.
